

## We Want To Hear From You

The U.S. Army recently completed the Section 36 Balance of Areas (BOA) Soil Remediation 95 percent design document. This is one of 31 projects that make up the Record of Decision (ROD). The ROD, which was signed by the Army, the State of Colorado, and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) on June 11, 1996, provides a detailed description of the cleanup approach selected for Rocky Mountain Arsenal (RMA).

The Section 36 BOA project consists of 11 sites within the central area of RMA. The sites consist of inactive chemical sewer lines, munitions testing locations, waste storage areas, potential waste disposal sites, and areas of windblown surface contamination.

Soil, munitions debris, and associated sewer line debris at this site will be excavated and disposed of in the on-site Hazardous Waste Landfill. Excavated areas will be backfilled with clean soil and graded to provide adequate drainage and to control erosion. Vegetation over the disturbed remediation and borrow areas will be re-established. Soil covers will be constructed over parts of the Section 36 BOA where biota risk soils are left in place. The U.S. Army will provide long-term maintenance for the cover areas.
